 - o The "liberty of spontaneity" (nobody forces me to do something)
 - o The "liberty of indifference" (I could have chosen otherwise)
- Two directions to freedom ...
 - o Freedom from (otherwise known as "negative liberty")
 - o Freedom to (otherwise known as "positive liberty")
